## Annual Clean-Up Day June 4, 8:00 am at Terry Park

Our annual bulky waste clean-up day will be held on Saturday June 4, from 8 am to noon, or until containers are full. Disposal and recycling containers will be set up at Terry Park on South Madison Street. This event is free for Lafayette residents only and photo identification will be required.

### Acceptable items

- Household appliances that have never contained Freon/refrigerant
- Automotive and rechargeable batteries
- Electronics: computers, laptops, TVs, monitors, printers, and related technology
- Scrap metal
- Household furniture and mattresses



### Items that will not be accepted

- Construction and demolition materials
- Any material with asbestos
- Tires, which can be disposed for a fee (\$4 off rim or \$8 on rim) at the recycling center, 2200 NE Orchard Avenue, McMinnville
- Hazardous waste, including liquid waste such as paint and yard chemicals
- Yard debris, which can be disposed at Recology Organics in McMinnville at no charge to Lafayette residents

Try to ensure that all materials can be easily transferred from your vehicle to the disposal bins. Volunteers will be available to assist with this process, to minimize personal contact.

## Code Enforcement: Yard Maintenance

Being a good neighbor is essential to being part of a community. Here are some basic exterior maintenance reminders to help you get started and keep your yard and property in tip-top shape as summer gets closer:

- Mow the lawn. Grass and weeds should not grow to a height of more than 10 inches.
- Shrubs, weeds, and blackberry briars must be maintained and kept out of the public thoroughfare. No vegetation should invade your neighbor's yard. This includes tree limbs, spreading shrubs, and weeds.
- Remove all bicycles, skateboards, and toys from the front yard at the end of the day. Make sure no items are left on the sidewalks or streets.

Beginning in mid-May, the City will be sending compliance letters to residents as a reminder to cut tall weeds and grass. This is an important step to prevent fire hazards and avoid a potential fine for failure to comply with City ordinances.
