### Code Enforcement: Animals & Pets

Pets and wildlife are important to many people; however, be aware that the City has rules in place for specific types of animals. Please remember:

- A permit is required for keeping chickens and/or rabbits on your property within the city limits of Lafayette. There are certain regulations that need to be met and maintained. Roosters, peacocks, and geese are not allowed.
- Dogs need to be current on vaccines, rabies shots, and have a Yamhill County Dog License to be allowed to be kept as a pet.
- All dogs need to be kept on a leash when being walked; don't forget to clean up after them. Pet waste stations are located in all city parks.
- Leaving food outside to feed strays also attracts other animals like opossums, raccoons, squirrels, and skunks, which may bring diseases and harm your pets.

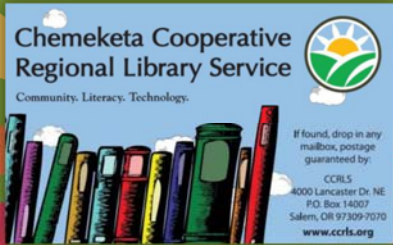
### Fire Department Toy Drive
